Virtual Race Across Alaska

The Race Across Alaska Winter Challenge, a multi-sport challenge, is a great way to get outside while



challenging yourself to stay happy and healthy during winter. Here is how it works. You can run, walk, fat bike, indoor bike, cross country ski or swim. You can choose from six different virtual distances – from 125 miles, 1.4 miles a day, to 2,000 miles, which is a whopping 22.3 miles per day. New this year is a 5-person relay of 2,000 miles which is the distance from Ketchikan to Deadhorse. The goal is to log as many miles as you can over the three months of winter to get (virtually) from location A to B: • 125 miles = Anchorage to Seward, AK,

that is 1.4 miles/day • 225 miles = Anchorage to Homer, AK, that's 2.5 miles/day • 350 miles = Anchorage to Fairbanks, AK, that is 3.9 miles/day • 850 miles = Anchorage to Deadhorse, AK, that is 9.5 miles/day • 2,000 miles = Ketchikan to Deadhorse, AK, that is 22.3 miles/day.

You will have the ability to log your miles, track your progress, collect virtual badges and see how you rank on the leader board daily. Online registration began November 25 and the virtual race starts on Winter Solstice – December 21. See the website for more details: www.raawc.com/Race/AK/Anchorage/AlaskaChallenge

The Challenge is a fundraiser for the Alaska Long Trail project. For every racer that participates, \$10 will be donated to Alaska Trails. Racers can also donate additional funds to support the development of The Alaska Long



Trail. Last year nearly \$20,000 was donated through participation and donations. The official race cannon will be fired at the Zoom Kickoff Party on December 21 at 4:30 pm.

Kenai Peninsula Winter Recreation map

Chugach National Forest has a new digital map highlighting winter recreation opportunities on Chugach Forest lands on the Kenai Peninsula. The free map includes trails, recreation facilities and winter motorized access, along with basic winter and avalanche safety information. The map is available through Avenza Maps, an offline mobile maps application (app) for iOS and Android smartphones. Simply scan the QR code with a mobile device to access the Kenai Peninsula Winter Recreation Map in Avenza. Visitors will be prompted to install the free app prior to downloading the map. The map is also offered on the Forest website as 8.5 by 11 PDFs for home printing.

The Alaska Long Trail

Alaska Trails has received a \$25,000 grant from the Rasmuson Foundation to continue planning, mapping and organizing toward the goal of connecting existing and envisioned trails from Seward to Fairbanks into the Alaska Long Trail.
