ROAD COMMISSION ACTIVE IN KUSKOKWOM DISTRICT

The main work in the Kuskokwim region last season by the Alaska Road Commission, as reported by Superintendent Carl Lottsfeldt, who left the city today for Juneau, consisted of the completion of the automobile road between the Takotna and Ophir.

A new road on the Little Creek, in this section, was also advanced one and one-half miles. A new 25 mile tractor road was constructed between upper Tuluksak Landing and Bear Creek. This road has been used mostly by the New York Alaska Gold Mining company.

Road work in this section for next year, though as yet not officially approved, may consist of gravel surfacing between Flat and Iditarod.

Two Ford trucks were sent in last summer to help in this work. Mr. Lottsfeldt said work will also be started on the summer portage between Russian Mission, on Yukon, and Kaltshak on the Kuskokwim.

Some of the winter work consisted of placing mile posts on the Nenana-Flat trail between Telida and Flat. Thirty miles on the Flat-Holy Cross trail was relocated, shortening the old location 12 miles. New shelter cabins were constructed, one at the Little Delta, between Shageluk and Iditarod, one at the foothills on Tuluksak-Bear Creek trail, and two on the winter mail trail between Bethel and Quinhagak.
